Ingham ISD—High School Program Options

Capital Area Career Center

The Capital Area Career Center (CACC), located in Mason, provides career and technical courses for high school juniors and seniors from the following school districts: Dansville, East Lansing, Haslett, Holt, Leslie, Mason, Okemos, Stockbridge, Waverly, Webberville and Williamston. One of the offsite programs, CAHEP (Capital Area Healthcare Education Partnership) is also offered to the students of the Lansing School District. During the 2010-2011 school year, the CACC is offering 18 program choices to students, both on and off-site. In 2011-2012, two additional programs, CELS and Law Enforcement will be offered.

CACC programs offer the opportunity for students to earn high school academic and elective credit, college credit, and state and national certifications. Students attend CACC programs for a half day session, either in the morning or afternoon and then attend their local district for the other half of their day. Busing is provided by Ingham County districts to on-site programs offered in Mason. Students who are out of county, from the Lansing School District, or those students that attend an off-site program must be able to provide their own transportation each day.

the early college
at LCC

In November 2010, Ingham Intermediate School District (IISD) and Lansing Community College (LCC) announced a partnership to open an early college on LCC's downtown campus. The school has been named The Early College at LCC, or TEC @ LCC for short and will open in August of 2011. This school is for high school juniors who want to earn direct college credits up to an associate's degree or a technical certification in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics (STEM) related field. The Early College at LCC is a three year program, so students will remain on LCC's campus for grades 11-13.

The Early College at LCC is open to all public school students in the Ingham ISD service area. Students accepted into the program will take high school classes primarily in their junior year and begin taking college courses when they demonstrate proficiency. The academic program of The Early College is fairly rigorous, and students should expect to do two to three hours of homework every night and come prepared to class each day with questions and ideas.

High School Diploma Completion Initiative

The High School Diploma Completion Initiative (HSDCI) is a unique opportunity for mid-Michigan students who have disconnected from their high school to jump-start their education and career preparation. HSDCI is designed to provide today's high school dropouts with the tools to be successful in a demanding society and career.

HSDCI classes are held at Lansing Community College and are actual LCC courses, where students earn college credit concurrently while completing diploma requirements. While HSDCI courses are mainstream college courses that are part of the curricula at LCC, instructional methods at HSDCI are customized to maximize the learning opportunity for high school students.

HSDCI also features creative classroom learning environments and work-based learning experiences. HSDCI graduates have options to seek employment, further education, or a combination of both as they complete their college studies. A team of partners, including LCC, Ingham Intermediate School District and other business and industry leaders are committed to developing college-level curriculum for diploma completion as well as advanced training for work in high-demand technical careers. www.lcc.edu/hsdci

Other Completion Programs

The Ombudsman Alternative Education

Center—The Ombudsman Program, a collaboration between the Ingham Intermediate School District, and Educational Services of America, offers an alternative route to graduation for high schools students who are at risk of dropping out of school. The program features individualized computer-assisted instruction using on-line resources, and certified teachers are available to assist.

The program provides accredited instruction in seven specific areas:

- Essential skills such as reading, writing and math
- Science, including biology, chemistry & physics
- Social studies and citizenship
- Personal finance, consumer education and social skills development
- Health and recreation, including first aid and nutrition
- Aesthetics, which includes art appreciation & personal responsibility
